Newhall School District recently hosted the third annual Entrepreneur Event, which brought together students from all 10 schools in grades 3-6 nurturing creativity, problem-solving, and community engagement. Students were tasked to identify areas of a local park that required attention and presented a range of creative and thoughtful ideas that aimed to enhance the park experience for all visitors. - Safety: Wild Animal Detection Cameras

- Education: Promoting Park and Wildlife Stewardship
- Health: Vending Machines for First Aid
- Innovation: Allergy-Reducing Machines
- Beautification: Natural Shade and Landscaping

POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS & SUPPORTS

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) <u>is an evidence-based</u>, tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health. When implemented with fidelity, <u>PBIS improves</u> social emotional competence, academic success, and school climate. It also improves teacher health and wellbeing. It is a way to create positive, predictable, equitable and safe learning environments where everyone thrives.

- <u>TIER 1</u>: Tier 1 practices and systems establish a foundation of regular, proactive support while preventing unwanted behaviors. Schools provide these universal supports to all students, school-wide.
- <u>TIER 2</u>: Tier 2 practices and systems support students who are at risk for developing more serious problem behaviors before those behaviors start. These supports help students develop the skills they need to benefit from core programs at the school.
- <u>TIER 3</u>: Tier 3 students receive more intensive, individualized support to improve their behavioral and academic outcomes. At this level, schools rely on formal assessments to determine a student's need.

In 2015, California PBIS initiated a statewide effort to implement a recognition system to acknowledge schools for implementing PBIS with fidelity to the national framework. Schools may apply to be recognized as Bronze, Silver, Gold, or Platinum PBIS schools.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT & TRANSFERS



Student Enrollment

Registration is open year round online for new students in grades UPK through 6th grade. Click on the Enrollment section of the website for more information at www.newhallschooldistrict.com. Currently, there are several schools impacted in specific grade levels. In those instances, students are diverted to the closest school until space opens up at the home school.

The enrollment window for the 2025-2026 school year will begin in January 2025. Visit the website at www.newhallschooldistrict.com for more information, including age-eligibility for grades and enrollment requirements.

Student Transfers

An intradistrict transfer or "open enrollment" is when parents/guardians wish to enroll their student(s) at a school other than the designated "home" school within the District. The open enrollment period for the current school year is closed for existing families, unless there is a change of residence.

An interdistrict transfer is when parents/guardians wish to enroll their student(s) in a school within the District, but live outside of the Newhall School District boundaries. Interdistrict transfers applications are accepted year round. The interdistrict transfer process begins withe the district of residence.

Both open enrollment and interdistrict transfer applications will be treated with equal priority. Approval is subject to space availability in the district, at a school site, grade level, or within a specific program. An approved transfer into the District may not result in attendance at the site requested. In the event there are more requests than spots available, a waiting list for the school will be established. Parents must provide transportation to the selected school. The window to apply for open enrollment or an interdistrict transfer for the 2025/2026 year will open in January 2025.
