I am excited to share some great updates from the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE). We have several initiatives underway that reflect our dedication to innovation, collaboration, and community engagement. These initiatives are poised to have a significant positive impact on our students, educators, and wider community.

Introduction of County Data Dashboard: LACOE is launching a groundbreaking County data dashboard called AskED that will empower schools to monitor their performance across key metrics such as health, wellbeing, and academic achievement. This innovative tool will enable educators to identify areas for improvement, benchmark their progress

against other schools, and tailor interventions to meet the unique needs of their students. By providing real-time insights, this tool directly supports our efforts to improve student outcomes, strengthen community, and model organizational excellence and innovation. AskED is expected to launch this Spring.

Formation of AI Task Force: Recognizing the growing importance of artificial intelligence (AI) in education, LACOE has established an AI Task Force to develop guidelines to support school districts in implementing AI policies and practices. The group is comprised of educators, students, administrators, and representatives from non-profit and for-profit organizations from across Los Angeles County. Their goals include addressing the opportunities and challenges associated with artificial intelligence, enhancing student learning and operational efficiency, and ensuring its ethical and responsible deployment. By leveraging the expertise and insights of its members, the task force aims to publish its findings by June 2024 so that school districts can use the guidelines to strategically integrate AI into their educational programs and operations this fall.

Expansion of Community Schools: Community schools are the heart of our district's commitment to holistic student development. We are proud to announce the expansion of our community schools initiative, which aims to provide comprehensive support services to students and families, including healthcare, social services, and academic enrichment programs. Through the California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP) and funding from the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health, the LACOE Community Schools Initiative division has expanded its reach to eight new school sites, serving over 23,000 students in 24 school sites. Our Community School Initiative has received more than \$20 million in funding from CCSPP for Cohort 1 and 2. By fostering strong partnerships with local organizations and community members, we will create nurturing environments where every student can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally.

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Proposition 28 Funding for Arts and Music Programs: Thanks to the passage of Proposition 28, school districts can now receive additional funding to bolster arts and music education. From expanding arts curriculum to offering professional development opportunities and hiring more teachers, this funding will open a world of artistic possibilities for our schools and students. Visit LACOE's website for information on how to strategize to build or further develop a comprehensive arts program in dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts in every school and grade level. The arts directly support our goal of strengthening community, as they foster creativity, self-expression, and cultural appreciation among our students. By providing more opportunities for students to explore their talents and passions, we are investing in their wellbeing and nurturing a sense of belonging.

Career Technical Education Grant: Preparing students for successful futures means equipping them with the skills and knowledge needed to thrive in diverse career pathways. Career Technical Education (CTE) programs provide students with hands-on learning experiences in high-demand fields such as technology, healthcare, education and climate-related fields. By forging partnerships with industry leaders and leveraging connections with community colleges, we will empower students to explore their interests, gain valuable certifications, and pursue rewarding careers upon graduation. LACOE was awarded the California Golden State Pathways Program Regional Technical Assistance Center contract for \$2.35 million to support schools in developing and promoting high-quality CTE Pathways lending to high-wage, highskill, high-growth careers. By investing in career readiness, we are not only supporting our students' future success but also strengthening our community and supporting our strategic pillars of improving student outcomes and championing individual and collective care and wellbeing.

We are thrilled to embark on these initiatives and look forward to sharing our progress with our community. By aligning our efforts with our strategic vision, we are confident that we can create a brighter future for our students, schools, and neighborhoods.



missing 10% or more of their days enrolled). The district's ADA was at a historic low of 95.5%. In 2023, SUSD saw a dramatic decrease in chronic attendance to 10.7% (-2.1%). Preventative measures and monitoring ensure that parents understand the connection between positive student attendance, positive student mental health, and positive student academic progress. To date, SUSD is seeing the ADA over 96% and chronic attendance at 8%.

SUSD continues focusing on the wellness of all members of the organization. The programs/practices implemented across the district are designed to wrap students in the security of physical and social-emotional wellness. In 2022, SUSD participated in the Alliance for a Healthier Generation's Healthiest Schools program. Two schools, Cedarcreek Elementary and West Creek Academy, were recognized as All-Star schools (recognition in all nine areas for the award program). In 2023, SUSD was honored to have all 15 of its school sites nationally recognized as part of the Healthiest Schools in America. We also have a group of students participating in the SeaPerch Challenge. Students will build and operate an underwater ROV (remotely operated vehicle) fostering basic engineering, design, and science concepts.

Beyond the realm of the sciences, Temple City High School launched a financial algebra class, which students have found to be both practical and valuable. Looking ahead, the district will use this next year to develop a Mandarin dual immersion class.
