(These costs are tracked in the goal field for regionalized operations and in the function field for instructional services.)
- 7. Use of property taxes allocated to the SELPA pursuant to EC Section 2572. (Property taxes allocated to the SELPA are tracked in the resource field and identified by a revenue code in the object field.)
