2022 has been generally welcomed with an optimism that we are past the worst of the pandemic, and life will soon be normal. Normal doesn't mean the same however, and I reflect on the change in the ways we communicate with stakeholders, and the great increase in parent voices in all aspects of the School District. This national trend of parent engagement is, in my opinion, a good outcome of the pandemic. Parent voices are always welcomed and encouraged at Newhall School District.

We experienced significant increases in attendance via zoom at Board meetings, school site meetings, Superintendent chats, PTA/PTO, and other committees of the district. Public comment at our meetings is one way we hear from you. The Superintendent's monthly chats are done on Zoom and have provided a way for the district to communicate what is happening, and for the Superintendent to hear questions and concerns from stakeholders.

Recently the District held several zoom information nights centering on enrollment and programs that the district offers (Pre-school and Dual Language for example). February is also a key month in the process of developing the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). Many sessions have been held to both inform on the LCAP and solicit input that will lead to what programs and activities will be planned for the next three years to support student learning. Parent engagement is required and is essential to a well thought out plan. There is still time to reflect and put forward ideas by reaching out to your school site Principal, or representatives from your school that are participating on the District's LCAP Advisory Council (new this year!). A list of the representatives for your site is on the LCAP page of the district website. Your voices are important to NSD!

En general, el año 2022 ha sido recibido con el optimismo de que ya hemos pasado lo peor de la pandemia, y que la vida pronto será normal. Recientemente, el distrito llevo a cabo varias noches informativas sobre zoom centrado en la inscripción y los programas que el distrito ofrece (preescolar y doble inmersión, por ejemplo). Febrero es también un mes clave en el proceso de desarrollo del Plan de Control Local de Rendición de Cuentas (LCAP). Muchas sesiones se han llevado a cabo para informar sobre el LCAP y solicitar información que conducirá a los programas y actividades que se planificarán para los próximos tres años para apoyar el aprendizaje de los estudiantes. La participación de los padres es necesaria y es esencial para un plan bien pensado. Todavía hay tiempo para reflexionar y proponer ideas poniéndose en contacto con el director de su escuela, o con los representantes de su escuela que participan en el Consejo Asesor del LCAP del Distrito (¡nuevo este año!). Una lista de los representantes de su escuela está en la página del LCAP del sitio web del distrito. ¡Sus voces son importantes para NSD!

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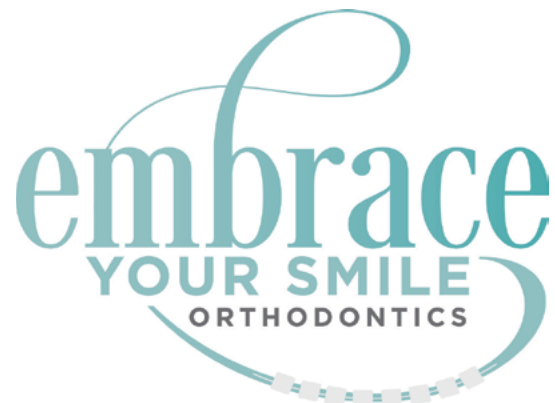

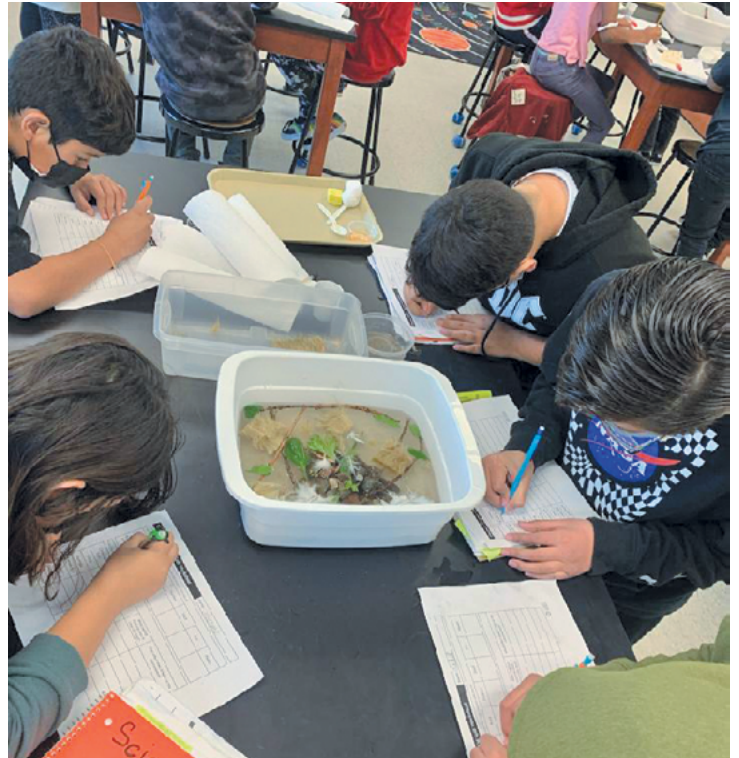

Each year, the Santa Clarita Valley Education Foundation sponsors Teacher Innovation Grants through which teachers can request up to \$1,500 to go toward the purchase of resources to support their instruction. The Foundation looks for requests that are innovative and offer a long-lasting impact on students.

In February, Old Orchard was proud to have one of our very own educators, Megan McMillan, awarded a Teacher Innovation Grant that will help build our students' language skills through storytelling. As a speech-language pathologist, Ms. McMillan looks for creative ways to promote oral-language development and address the language needs of our diverse student population. Story Champs, a research-based, multitiered language-intervention curriculum, uses storytelling to help promote academic language. The program will allow our staff to identify students who can demonstrate growth through general-education supports and interventions and differentiate students who may need further support through the realm of special education.



Since the curriculum is offered in both English and Spanish, Story Champs will benefit both English-dominant and Spanish-dominant speakers. While initial intervention will begin with students in dual-language immersion, the program can also be utilized in the future with all students.

After-School Math Academy

With the help of the supplemental dollars that Peachland Elementary receives as a Title 1 site, we are proud to say that this spring we are offering after-school math learning intervention sessions for students in grades three through six. This after-school opportunity allows our students to sharpen and fine-tune their skills.

Some of our dynamic classroom teachers are making learning fun by taking grade-level standards and then applying hands-on fun developmental concepts that their students can expand upon outside the regular school day. We are focusing on skills such as understanding place value, applying math concepts to the real world, finding more than one way to solve problems, estimating and rounding, and basic beginning algebra.

Our school is grateful for parents who allow their students to participate, our teachers who dedicate their

time beyond the school day to design and implement this great opportunity, and to the students who show up ready to develop their mathematical minds.

For all of you math lovers out there – challenge yourself!

Problem 1: Bertie has just had a big win at the lottery. He spends $\frac{4}{5}$ of his money on a large house. He spends $\frac{3}{4}$ of his remaining money on a luxury yacht. Robo Huskies Learn to Code

Thanks to Mr. Bryan Eifert and Mrs. Kim Hartzog, our lead teachers, Pico Canyon students participate in a program called First Lego League (FLL). The lead teachers/coaches partner with some really great high school and college mentors, and all are former Pico Robotics team members: Adhitya Ram, Jaeun Park, Owen Doupner, Connor Hartzog, and Minjun Kim.

On Saturday, November 20th, our Pico Cyber Huskies and Robo Huskies competed against 15 other teams at the L.A. Regional Qualifying Tournament held at Valencia High School. Our Cyber Huskies finished in first place with their Robot Performance Score of 335 points. Our Robo Huskies finished right behind them in second place with a Robot Performance Score of 310 points. These were the highest scores that both teams have ever achieved!

Our teams went on to compete at West Ranch High School on Sunday, December 12th for the Southern California FLL Championships. The Pico Cyber Huskies were recognized for their

innovative project solutions, and they were also able to share their project ideas with industry professionals as a final nominee for the Global Innovation Award. At the Championships, we earned second place for Core Values, and our robot performance finished in 20th place out of the 52 teams present. We are super-excited to add three new trophies to our ever-growing school collection!

Mr. Eifert proudly reports that, "Our students are constantly challenged to think creatively, work together as a team to overcome obstacles, and develop self-esteem and confidence as leaders!"

Learning Recovery

The Wiley Canyon Elementary staff kicked off the 2021-2022 school year with learning recovery in the forefront of every decision made. We started the school year with six credentialed teachers and one curriculum specialist who serve 270 students in

different grades and academic areas. They either provide

intervention or enrichment support, depending on the needs of the students. Our primary focus is around skills such as phonemic awareness, phonics rules, reading fluency, reading comprehension, vocabulary and language development, grammar skills, writing conventions, and sequencing, text based evidence, and various skills and concepts in the area of math.

It's been exciting to observe student success. At this point in the school year, we have seen 21 students in grades kindergarten through second exit the program due to the progress they have made. The bi-weekly data analysis and student monitoring is what makes this program so effective. We are so proud of our students and staff! Go Wiley Wolves!
